I would like to thank you, Jared Fernandez and Tim Neretich for helping me get my business debt free and operating on business and not fending off debt collectors.

On September 1, 2001 I closed the purchase of a second print shop. On September 11, the movers were in the process of moving the equipment to my original location, when we heard the news from New York. Talk about a sinking feeling. Business was bad for the next 2 years and we were doing a slow slide backward. We purchased some new equipment, but technology was changing so fast that it was obsolete within 2 years and we had 60 month leases. In 2005 we closed the production end of the business and moved into a small office and became print brokers. This eliminated most of our overhead but we still had the equipment leases and were behind with our vendors. In late December I started to contact bankruptcy attorneys but found that our case was too small (\$60,000) for them to take on. I talked with another company that wanted a large check up front to handle my case, which I didn't have.

Then in late 2006, I talked to Tim and we worked out a budget, and started referring collectors to CT. Some of the hard core collectors claimed they "don't deal with those people". THEY DO!! There were a few bumps along the way but Jared and you were always positive and helped me through.

Today I have a 5 year plan, no accounts payable and a good base of business. I spend my time making sales calls, not dealing with bill collectors.
